Introduction

The Workplace Gender Equality Agency (WGEA) is an Australian Government statutory authority which aims to improve gender equality in Australian workplaces. WGEA is responsible for administering the *Workplace Gender Equality Act 2012* (Act), which puts a focus on promoting and improving gender equality outcomes for women and men in Australian workplaces.

Purpose

The purpose of this plan is to:

- → assist WGEA in planning and developing its IPS entry
- → show what information types WGEA publishes
- → show how WGEA meets IPS requirements.

Objectives

This plan outlines how WGEA posts current and relevant information under the IPS.

Establishing and administering WGEA's IPS entry

The WGEA Operations Executive Manager is the designated senior officer responsible for leading WGEA's compliance with the IPS.

Establishing WGEA's IPS entry

→ The WGEA Operations Executive Manager, supported by the WGEA Records Manager, established the WGEA IPS entry.

Administering WGEA's IPS entry

- WGEA's ongoing compliance with the IPS is coordinated by the WGEA Operations Executive Manager, with input from the WGEA Communications Manager.
- → WGEA engages with the Australian community about its IPS entry by:
 - making IPS documents easily discoverable, understandable and readable
 - providing a method for members of the public to contact WGEA to provide IPS feedback.
- In circumstances where an IPS document cannot be accessed through the WGEA website, the WGEA Operations Executive Manager will be the point of contact for access requests.
- → WGEA may charge a person for accessing documents under the IPS if:
 - they are impracticable to publish online
 - ✓ providing access requires a significant allocation of time and resources,
- → WGEA will not impose a charge where the reimbursement or cost is lower than \$100.

IPS information architecture

To ensure that the WGEA IPS entry is easily discoverable, understandable and readable, WGEA:

- → designed and published an IPS entry point on its website
- presents online content in a format that can be searched and copied
- provides a search function for its website
- → wherever possible, publishes content on the WGEA website that conforms to the web content accessibility guidelines (WCAG) 2.0 standard.

Information required to be published under the IPS

- → Documentation identified as 'required' under IPS guidelines is published on the WGEA website.
- → The WGEA website has a dedicated IPS page for required documentation including this plan.
- → Links are also available for IPS documentation located outside of the IPS page.
- → WGEA structures the IPS page under the following headings:
 - ✓ WGEA IPS plan
 - ✓ Who we are
 - ✓ What we do
 - Reports to Government
 - Publications
 - Freedom of Information (FOI)

IPS compliance review

- → WGEA reviews this plan annually.
- → WGEA reviews the operation of its IPS every five years in accordance with the guidelines issued by the Office of the Australian Information Commissioner (OAIC).
- → WGEA measures compliance against the following criteria:
 - ✓ a current and comprehensive IPS plan
 - WGEA's information management framework; supported by the WGEA records management system
 - ✓ a robust review and publication process for IPS documentation
 - ✓ information through the WGEA website is accessible according to WCAG 2.0 standards.
